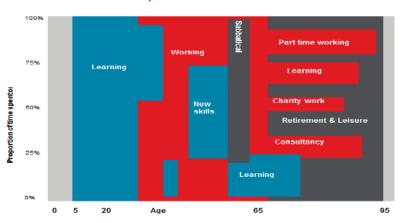

Move away from linear and sequential...



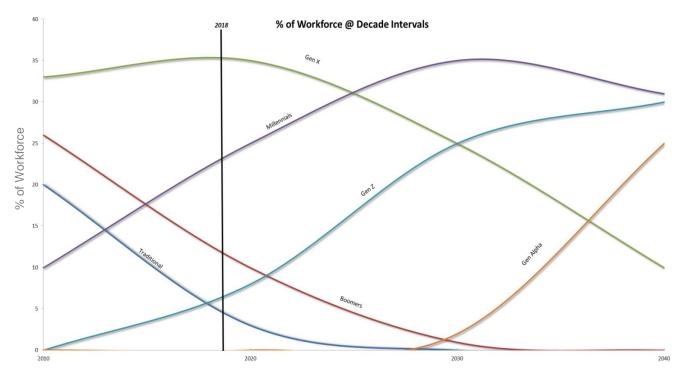
...to mosaic and parallel

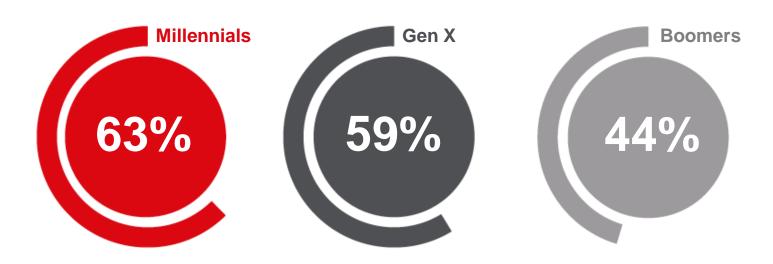

Mega trend: macro working lifecycle

Insight

- AGE: assumptions on life stages
- RELEVANCE: of 'old ways' to reward & motivate
 - TIMING: annual benefits in work hours may be 'out of touch'

Impact: Improved employee engagement

Action

- SURVEY EMPLOYEES: data from them
- TARGETED COMMS: based on data triggers
- ATTITUDINAL SEGMENTATION: intuitive employee interactions
- REVIEW BENEFITS: introduce new ones e.g. sabbatical
- TECH TO LEAD: personalise and speed up decision making



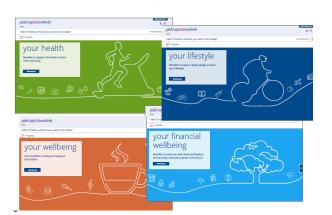
